Bus Driver/Trainer Revised 7/11

DEFINITION

Under the general supervision of the Director of Transportation, operates a school bus over designated routes to transport student; organize and conduct instruction and behind-the-wheel training and refresher training for District bus drivers. To perform duties of a bus driver related to special assigned schedules and other related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES/ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Bus Driver

- Drives a bus on a daily basis over designated routes picking up and discharging students in accordance with specified time schedules. E
- Transport students and staff on special trips to various locations within the state. E
- Maintain order among students while on the bus and while at bus stops. E
- Follow specified start up and shut down procedures before and after each run. E
- Maintain bus cleanliness in accordance with district guidelines. E
- Prepare log and reports as directed. E
- May be included on the trip assignment rotation list(s) at the discretion of the Director of Transportation .E
- Determine appropriate action in potential or real medical emergency situations according to established guidelines and administer first aid to passengers as needed. E
- Conduct required daily safety inspections of buses, inspecting interior, exterior and engine of the vehicles. E
- Report major mechanical malfunctions or other problems as required. E
- Maintain mileage, logs, time records, and related records. E
- Maintain required in-service hours needed and required by law to maintain current school bus drivers license. E
- Perform other duties as assigned.

<u>Trainer</u>

- Maintain current knowledge of driving, training and safety requirements. E
- Determine and provide instruction on appropriate action in potential or real medical emergency situations according to established guidelines and administer first aid to passengers as needed. E
- Attend safety meetings; driver education and safety programs as directed. E
- Maintain effective communications with co-workers, supervisor, and dispatcher. E
- Provide instruction and assist bus drivers in the performance of their duties; including safety meetings and driver education programs. E
- Evaluate driver knowledge, skills and performance standards related to efficiency, safety and legality. E
- Coordinate training activities with the Director of Transportation. E
- Assist in routine departmental functions as requested. E
- May investigate accidents, and may monitor performance of evacuation exercises if requested by Director of Transportation. E
- Conduct driver check-in to be sure all routes are covered, make fog calls to determine if conditions require a delay, check driver logs and mileage sheets to for accuracy, general record keeping, etc. E
- Provide bus driver training and instruction for drivers to maintain in-service and renewal training requirements. E
- Maintain driver training records in accordance with State requirements and district policies. E
- Perform other duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of

- Safe and defensive driving practices.
- Proper operations of a school bus.
- Applicable traffic and student transportation laws, codes, and regulations (Calif. Motor Vehicle Code and Education Code).
- State and local traffic laws and regulations.
- School district geography.
- Basic first aid procedures.
- Basic record keeping and report preparation techniques.
- Interpersonal skills using patience, tact, and courtesy.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Oral and written communication skills.

Ability to.

- 1. Drive a school bus safely and efficiently.
- 2. Maintain a safe discipline level among passengers.
- 3. Observe and report safety hazards and need for maintenance and repairs.
- 4. Read and navigate from visual and written maps.
- 5. Learn and apply District policies and procedures related to student discipline.
- 6. Observe legal and defensive driving practices.
- 7. Maintain bus in clean and proper working condition.
- 8. Conduct safety inspections and perform routine preventive maintenance daily.
- 9. Administer first aid.
- 10. Maintain routine records.
- 11. Understand and follow oral and written directions.
- 12. Communicate effectively and professionally with others.
- 13. Meet schedules and time lines.
- 14. Operate a two-way radio and other communication equipment.
- 15. Handle situations with tact and diplomacy.
- 16. Work cooperatively with others.
- 17. Adjust to situations as necessary.
- 18. Supervise and motive bus drivers.
- 19. Maintain cooperative relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- 20. Relicense bus drivers when certificate expires.

21. Schedule and conduct effective instruction and behind-the-wheel training programs for bus drivers.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Environment

- Indoor/outdoor environment subject to changing temperatures exceeding 90 degrees at times.
- Direct contact with the public, students, and other District staff.
- May be exposed to heights, loud noises, fumes, dust, and other odors.
- Some assignments may require use of restraint procedures due to the nature and severity of the disabilities and/or assaultive or self abusive tendencies of pupils.
- May complete routes within tight deadlines and continuously changing priorities and interruptions.
- Work with moving vehicles and motorized wheelchair lifts and equipment.

Physical Demands

- Sitting, standing, and walking for extended periods of time.
- Lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds.
- Continuous use of hands, fingers, and wrists repetitively.
- Using both hands and legs simultaneously.
- Repeated stooping, bending, and kneeling.
- Occasional pushing, pulling, and maintaining balance.
- Reaching over head.
- Rapid mental/muscular coordination.
- Verbal, auditory, and written capabilities to effectively communicate in an articulate manner.
- Accurate depth perception.
- Clarity of vision at varying distances to see small details and have color vision/distinguish shades.
- Operate mobile motorized equipment.
- Drive a vehicle to conduct work.

Hazards

- Working with tools, and powered machinery.
- Possible contact with blood borne pathogens and /or bodily fluids.
