Common Core State Standards Overview

The Common Core Standards (CCSS) are an updated set of academic standards that have been developed with the intention of unifying learning expectations for students across all states. Common Core Standards bring strong advantages to students in California and in the United States. These standards define kindergarten through twelfth grade learning that will ensure that students are well prepared for post-secondary education and career.

The CCSS have been adopted by 46 states across the United States. California's State Board of Education adopted the CCSS in August 2010. The National Education Association, American Federation of Teachers and California Teachers Association were included in the discussion and were given a voice in providing input into the final version of the CCSS.

With the implementation of the CCSS, California has moved away from the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) assessment system, which ended in June 2014, and moved to a new system in the 2014-2015 school year. This new system will be referred to as the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). Within this system, students will take assessments referred as Smarter Balanced Assessments, which includes shifting from paper-and-pencil tests to computerized assessments. The new assessments are designed to meet federal and state-level accountability requirements and provide teachers and parents with timely and accurate information to measure and trace individual growth.

The Tulare Joint Union High School District began the transition to the CCSS three years ago by first providing extensive professional development to all teachers in the district, introducing them to the CCSS. In addition to the CCSS professional development, the district has also provided professional development on instructional strategies for teachers to bring about 21st classroom. The district followed this timeline of activities:

2011-2013:
