Custodian/Bus Driver Revised 2/23

DEFINITION

- 1. Under the supervision of the Maintenance and Operations Supervisor, maintains assigned building, group of buildings, including office space clean, orderly, and secure during assigned shift; and other related duties as required.
- 2. Under the supervision of the Transportation Supervisor, operates a school bus over designated routes to transport students safely and efficiently; perform regular safety inspections; prepare a variety of records and reports related to assigned activities; and other related duties as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES/ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Custodian

- Cleans restrooms, dressing rooms, shower rooms, classrooms, and common areas. E
- Stocks toilet and sanitary supplies. E
- Vacuums, sweeps, and mops floors. E
- Dusts and polishes furniture and wood work. E
- Empties and cleans waste receptacles. E
- Washes windows and walls. E
- Polishes metal work; and takes care of equipment and materials. E
- Set up and prepare rooms for special events and needs. E
- Reports needed repair work to proper authorities. E
- Performs minor repairs to building fixtures and equipment. E
- Operates and checks low pressure boiler, lights, gas heaters, and other related items. E
- Waxes and refinishes floors and shampoos carpets. E
- Pick up paper and other debris from grounds and buildings. E
- May be required to perform miscellaneous maintenance work such as touch up painting. E
- Operate a variety of district vehicles and equipment. E
- Assure security of buildings and grounds during assigned times. E
- Moves and/or re-arranges furniture, chairs, desks, tables, etc. E
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Bus Driver

- Drives a bus on a daily basis over designated routes picking up and discharging students in accordance with specified times schedules. E
- Transport students and staff on special trips to various locations within the state. E
- Maintains order among students while on the bus and while at bus stops. E
- Follows specified start up and shut down procedures before and after each run. E
- Maintains bus cleanliness in accordance with district guidelines. E
- Prepare log and reports as directed. E
- Conduct required daily safety inspections of buses, inspecting interior, exterior & engine of the vehicles. E
- Report major mechanical malfunctions or other problems as required. E
- Maintain mileage, logs, time records, and related records as required. E
- Determine appropriate action in potential or real medical emergency situations according to established guidelines and administer first aid to passengers as needed. E
- Attend safety meetings and driver education and safety programs as directed. E
- Maintain effective bus and bus-to-base communications. E
- Maintain effective communications between co-workers, supervisor, and dispatcher. E
- Maintain required in-service hours needed and required by law to maintain current school bus drivers license. E

• Perform other duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of

Custodian

- Modern cleaning methods including cleaning chalk and white boards, carpets, furniture, walls and fixtures.
- Proper methods, techniques, materials, disinfectants, tools and equipment used in modern custodial work.
- Safety best practices and work methods.
- Proper lifting techniques.
- Requirements for maintaining school buildings in a safe, clean and orderly condition.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Safe and defensive driving practices and methods.
- Read and understand Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS).
- Interpersonal skills using tact, patience, and courtesy.

Bus Driver

- Safe and defensive driving practices.
- Proper operations of school bus.
- Applicable traffic and student transportation laws, codes, and regulations (Calif. Motor Vehicle Code and Education Code).
- Basic first aid procedures.
- Basic record keeping and report preparation techniques.
- Interpersonal skills using patience, tact, and courtesy.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- State and local traffic laws and regulations.
- School district geography
- California Motor Vehicle Code and Education Code requirements pertaining to pupil transportation.

Ability to

Custodian

- 1. Maintain an assigned school site, group of buildings or office space in a clean, orderly, and secure manner during an assigned shift.
- 2. Maintain routine records such as work orders, equipment repairs and maintenance, chemical application, cleaning schedules, and overtime assignments.
- 3. Use common cleaning materials and equipment in a safe and efficient manner.
- 4. Operate a variety of district vehicles.
- 5. Learn custodial procedures, methods and schedules.
- 6. Observe and report safety hazards and need for maintenance and repair.
- 7. Maintain tools and equipment in clean working order.
- 8. Operate a variety of custodial equipment including a floor stripper, buffer, carpet cleaners, vacuum cleaner, and other small power and hand tools.
- 9. Move and arrange furniture and equipment for meetings and special events.
- 10. Perform minor repairs.
- 11. Understand and carry out oral and written instructions.
- 12. Meet schedules and timelines.
- 13. Work cooperatively with others.

Bus Driver

- 1. Drive a school bus safely and efficiently.
- 2. Maintain a safe discipline level among passengers.
- 3. Observe and report safety hazards and need for maintenance and repairs.
- 4. Read and navigate from visual and written maps.
- 5. Learn and apply District policies and procedures related to student discipline.
- 6. Observe legal and defensive driving practices.
- 7. Maintain bus in clean and proper working condition.
- 8. Conduct safety inspections.
- 9. Administer first aid.
- 10. Maintain routine records.
- 11. Understand and follow oral and written directions.
- 12. Communicate effectively and professionally with others.
- 13. Meet schedules and time lines.
- 14. Operate a two-way radio and other communication equipment.
- 15. Handle situations with tact and diplomacy.
- 16. Work cooperatively with others.
- 17. Adjust to situations as necessary.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Environment

- Indoor/outdoor environment subject to changing temperatures exceeding 90 degrees at times.
- May be exposed to heights, loud noises, fumes, dust, and other odors.
- Exposure to cleaning agents and chemical such as disinfectants, graffiti remover, floor stripper, floor wax, propane, paint thinner.
- Work in direct contact with the public, students, and other District staff.
- Some assignments may require use of restraint procedures due to the nature and severity of the disabilities and/or assaultive or self abusive tendencies of pupils.
- May complete routes within tight deadlines and continuously changing priorities and interruptions.
- May work with moving vehicles and motorized wheelchair lifts and equipment.
- Working on ladders.
- Driving a vehicle to conduct work while exposed to traffic and adverse weather conditions.

Physical Demands

- Standing, sitting, and walking for extended periods of time.
- Lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds.
- Occasional bending, stooping, kneeling, and crouching.

- Use fingers, wrists and/or hands repetitively.
- Use both hands and legs simultaneously.
- Ability to maintain balance.
- Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.
- Rapid mental/muscle coordination.
- Verbal, auditory, and written capabilities to effectively communicate in an articulate manner.
- Accurate depth perception.
- Clarity of vision at varying distances to see small details and have color vision/distinguish shades.
- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate mobile motorized equipment and a variety of custodial equipment.

Hazards

- Working with chemicals, tools, and powered machinery.
- Possible contact with blood borne pathogens and /or bodily fluids.
